## CRITICAL CARE EMERGENCY MEDICAL TRANSPORT PROGRAM OVERVIEW

The CCEMTP course is open to any paramedic, nurse, physician assistant, physician or registered respiratory therapist who has worked in that capacity for a minimum of one year. This intensive two and a half week course will prepare the student to become a critical care transport specialist. **Attendance at all classes is mandatory.** Students with 100% attendance will be evaluated with a written examination at the end of the course. Upon successful completion, the student will receive a renewable certification from UMBC valid for three years.

This 100 hour course has been approved by UMBC, an organization accredited by the Continuing Education Board of Emergency Medical Services (CECBEMS) [www.cecbems.org](http://www.cecbems.org). In addition, 100 hours of continuing education credits will be issued on an hour- for- hour basis through the Loyola EMS System and the Illinois Department of Public Health.
